



## 23<sup>rd</sup> Annual ENETS Conference for the Diagnosis and Treatment of Neuroendocrine Tumor Disease 4 – 6 March 2026

### Poster Guidelines

All accepted abstracts are eligible for e-poster presentation.

#### New in 2026:

**Posters will be presented as e-posters only!** There will be **no poster walls for printed posters**, and **authors should not bring printed posters to the conference.**

#### Instructions for Preparing a E-Poster

All e-posters will be accessible to all conference participants on **e-poster stations** and on the online **conference app** during the event. After the event, it will be exclusively available to conference participants in the **poster gallery** via the **myENETS** user area on [www.enets.org](http://www.enets.org).

- **Poster presentation: E-posters only!**
- **Orientation:** E-posters will be displayed **horizontally (landscape)**.
- **Template:** We recommend using the official ENETS poster template, available as a [PowerPoint file](#) on the conference website.
- **Logo Usage:** Ensure compliance with the [ENETS logo branding guidelines](#) when including the ENETS logo.
- **Poster ID Display:** You must clearly display your **Poster ID** (e.g. A01, A 02...) **on the top right corner** of your e-poster. This number will be emailed to all poster presenters before the conference and will also appear in the abstract booklet and in the conference programme.
- **Restrictions:** Names and/or logos of pharmaceutical companies **MUST NOT** appear on the e-posters. Use the term “industry-sponsored” instead.
- **Format and Upload:** E-posters must be submitted as a 1-page PDF file in landscape (horizontal) format **by Monday, 23 February, 23:59 CET**. A confirmation e-mail will be sent once your upload is successful.

#### Poster videos

Authors also have the option to upload a short video (maximum 2 minutes) summarising their poster. Poster videos will be accessible to all conference participants via the online conference app during the event and will also be displayed at on-site e-poster stations. After the event, they will remain available exclusively to conference participants in the poster gallery via the **myENETS user area** at [www.enets.org](http://www.enets.org).

- **Format and length:** Videos must be submitted in **MP4 format** and should not exceed **2 minutes** in length.

- **Subtitles:** Poster videos may be displayed at on-site e-poster stations where audio playback is not available. To ensure that viewers can fully understand the content, authors are therefore strongly recommended to include subtitles if their video contains spoken narration or commentary.
- **Upload:** A link to the online upload platform will be provided along with abstract confirmation.
- **Restrictions:** Names and/or logos of pharmaceutical companies **MUST NOT** appear in poster videos. Use the term “industry-sponsored” instead.
- **Logo usage:** Ensure compliance with the [ENETS logo branding guidelines](#) when including the ENETS logo.

## Tips for Designing an Effective and Engaging E-Poster

An optimal poster layout will attract the attention of other participants when viewed on screens. Create an **eye-catching design** while maintaining professionalism.

- Include the **abstract title, authors, institution, and institution’s location** at the top of the ENETS poster frame.
- The **abstract title** should serve as the headline and is a key element participants see when searching for or browsing e-posters.
- Organise your poster into clear sections reflecting the abstract format (Introduction/ Background, Aims /Objectives, Methods, Results, Conclusions).
- Ensure **readability** on digital displays and small screens:
  - Use **colour** strategically to create clear contrast between sections.
  - Avoid difficult-to-read colour combinations.
  - Limit the use of large tables and focus on using **graphs** to present data clearly.
- Highlight the main findings with a clear **“take-home message” placed prominently** on the poster.
- Write **conclusions in a sufficiently large font**, as this section is often viewed first in digital poster browsing.
- Clearly present the **scientific question** and its key answer to engage participants who may view the poster briefly.
